Sheikh-Jabbari is a young researcher of the Tehran-based Institute for Studies in Theoretical Physics and Mathematics.

He is being commended "for his important contributions to non-communicative field theories in the context of D-branes and superstring theories, leading to interesting formal and phenomenological developments in theoretical and mathematical physics," according to ICTP website.

The 2007 ICTP Prize is designated in the honor of the prominent Russian physicist Lev Davidovich Landau who won Nobel in 1962. His 100th birth anniversary will be celebrated in 2008.

The Institute for Studies in Theoretical Physics and Mathematics, one of the prestigious Iranian research centers, is preparing to host the renowned theoretical physicist Stephen Hawking in July.

He will participate in the International Physics Olympiad in Isfahan after attending meetings in Tehran.
